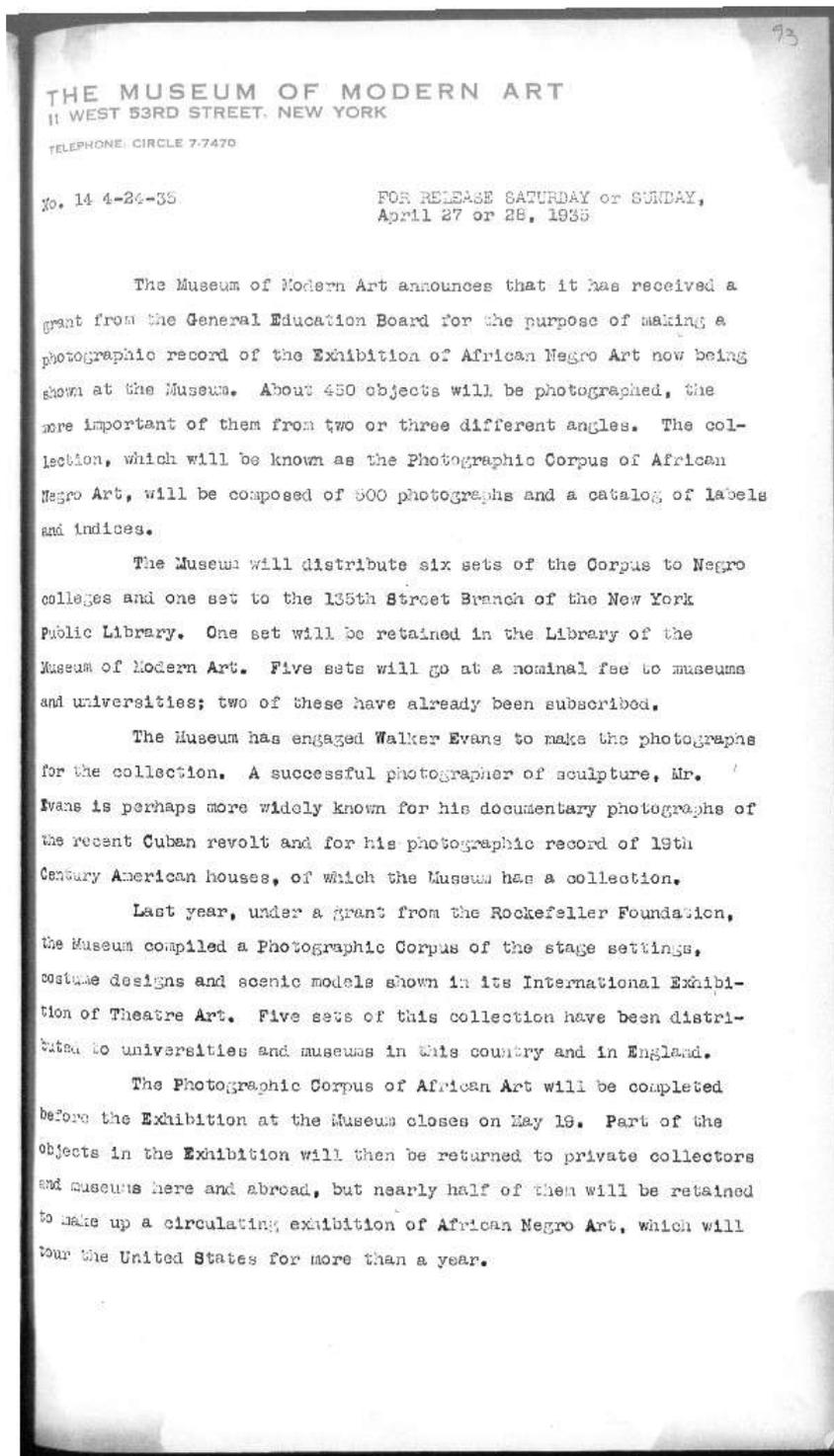
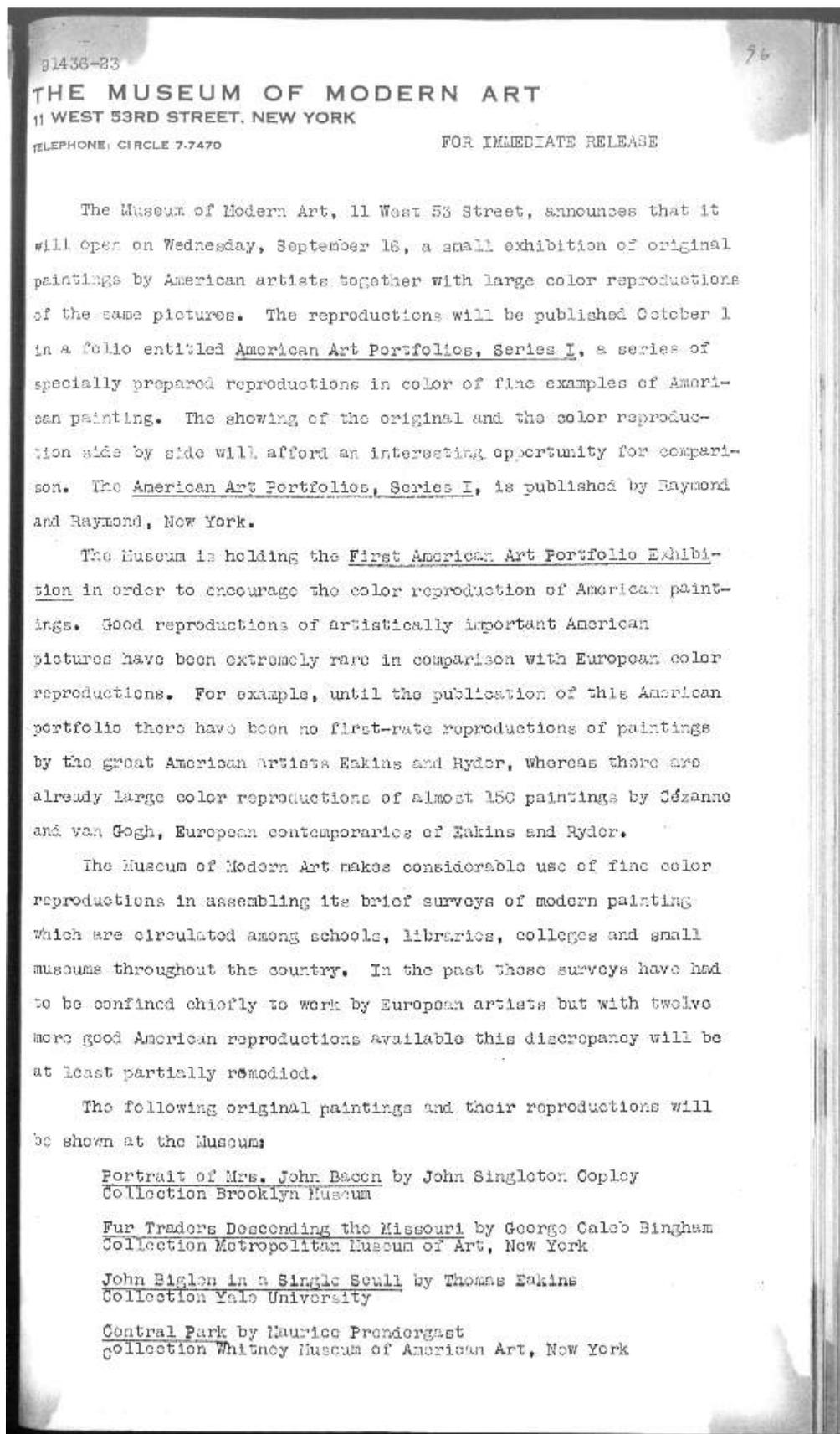


Figure 3 : News release n°91437-23, The Museum of Modern Art, New York.

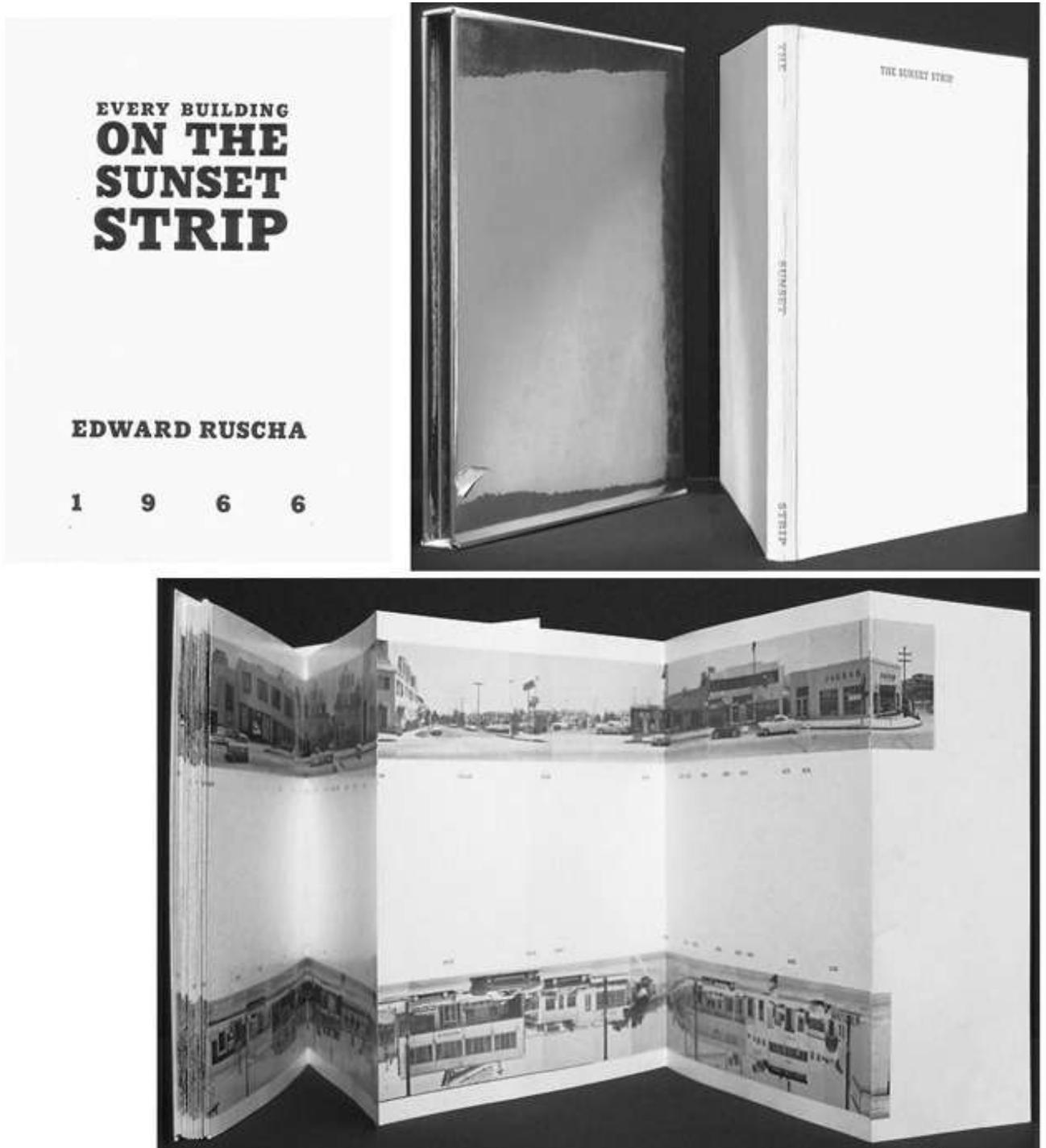


Figure 8 : Maquette originale réalisée par Ed Ruscha pour le livre *Every Building on the Sunset Strip*, 1966.

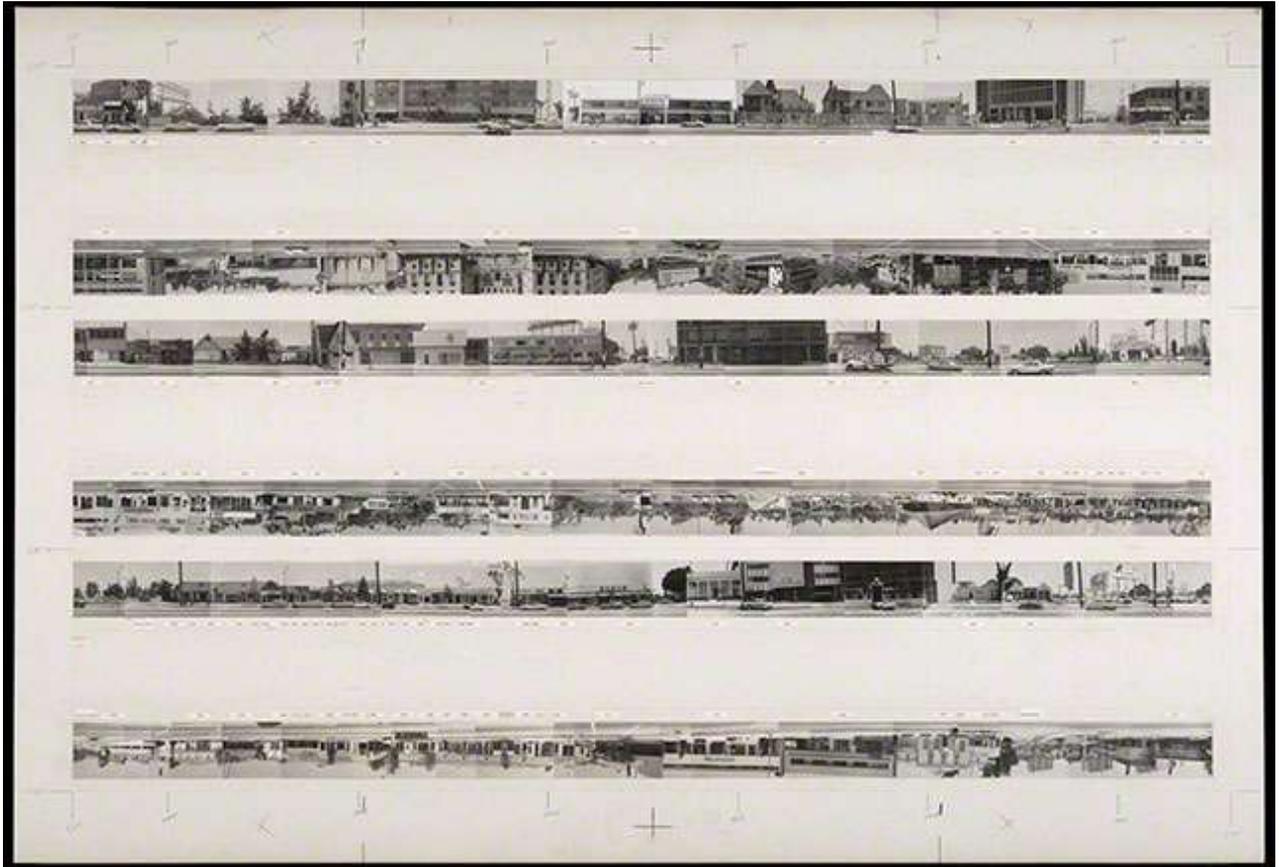


Figure 9 : Robert Venturi et Denise Scott-Brown, *Learning From Las Vegas*, 1972, fig. 65. Elevation du *strip* de Las Vegas.

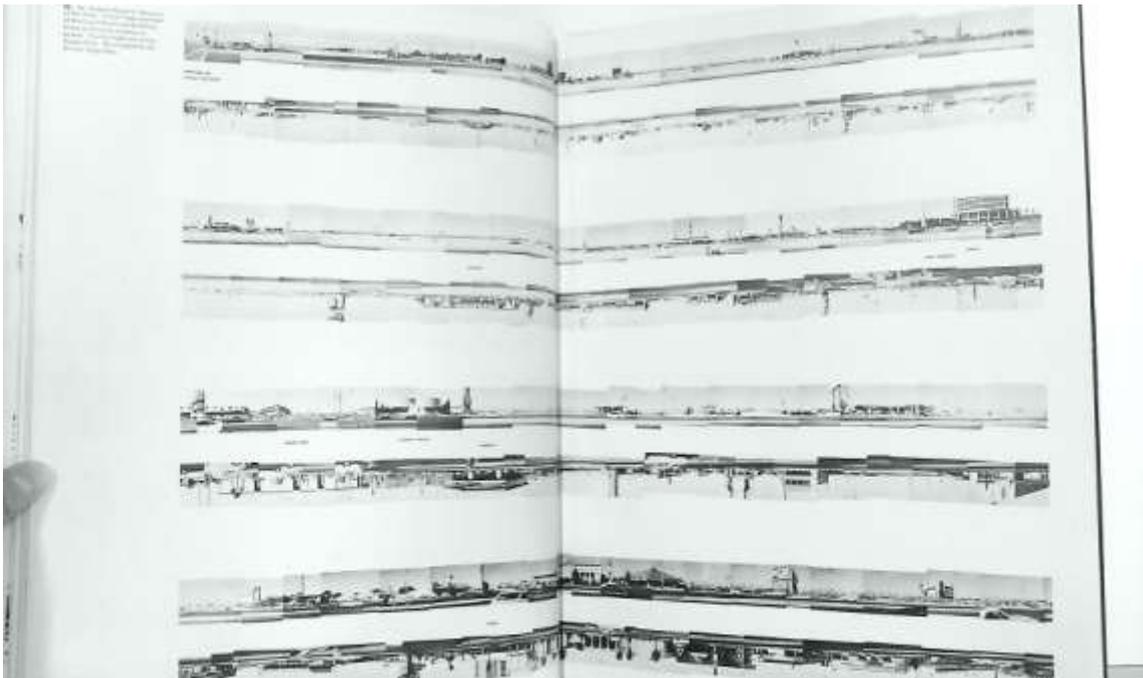


Figure 10 : Ed Ruscha, *Twentysix Gasoline Stations*, 1963.

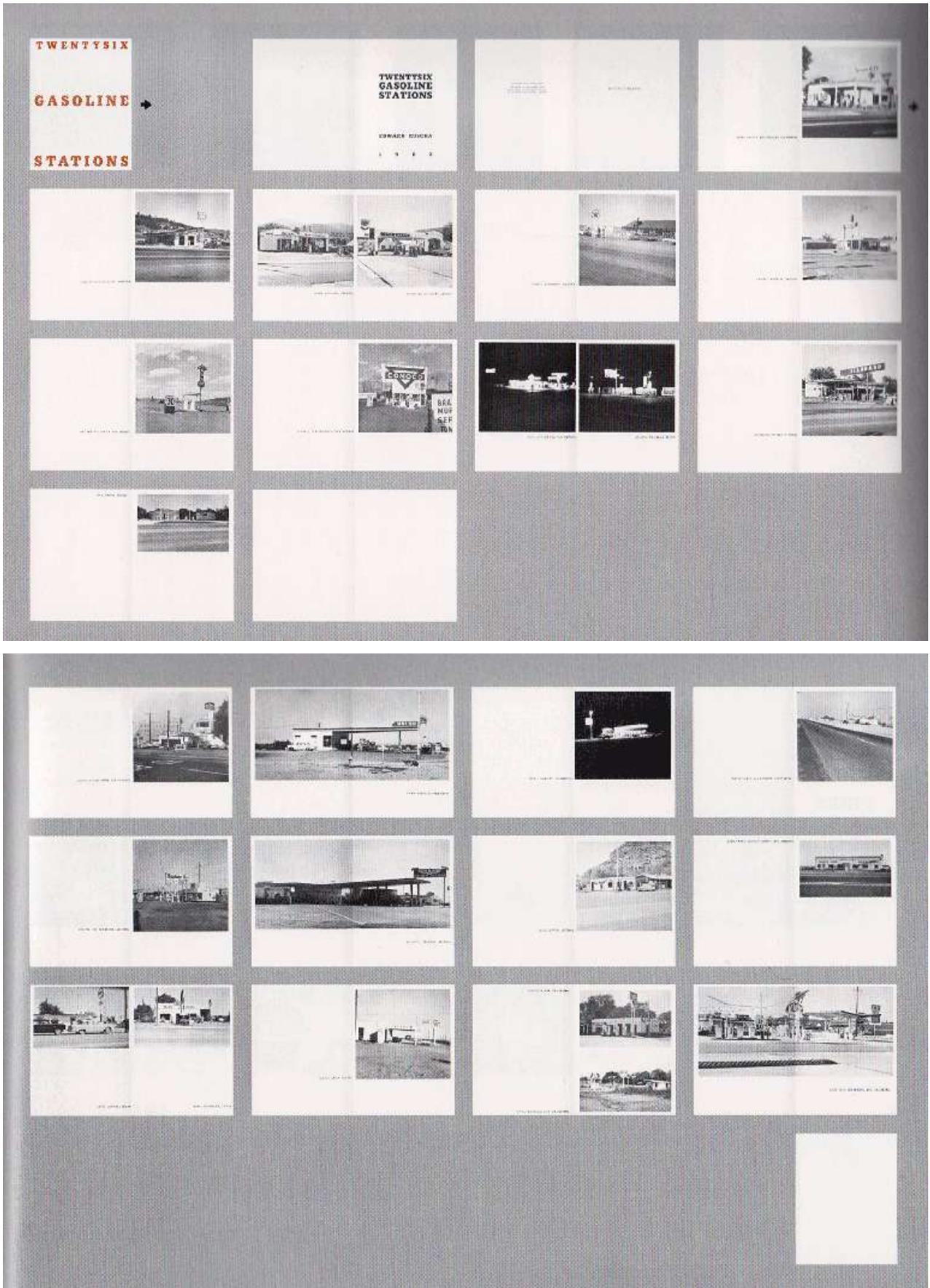


Figure 11 : Ed Ruscha, *Schell, Holbrook, Arizona*, 1962, recto et verso. Harry Ransom Center, The University of Texas, Austin.

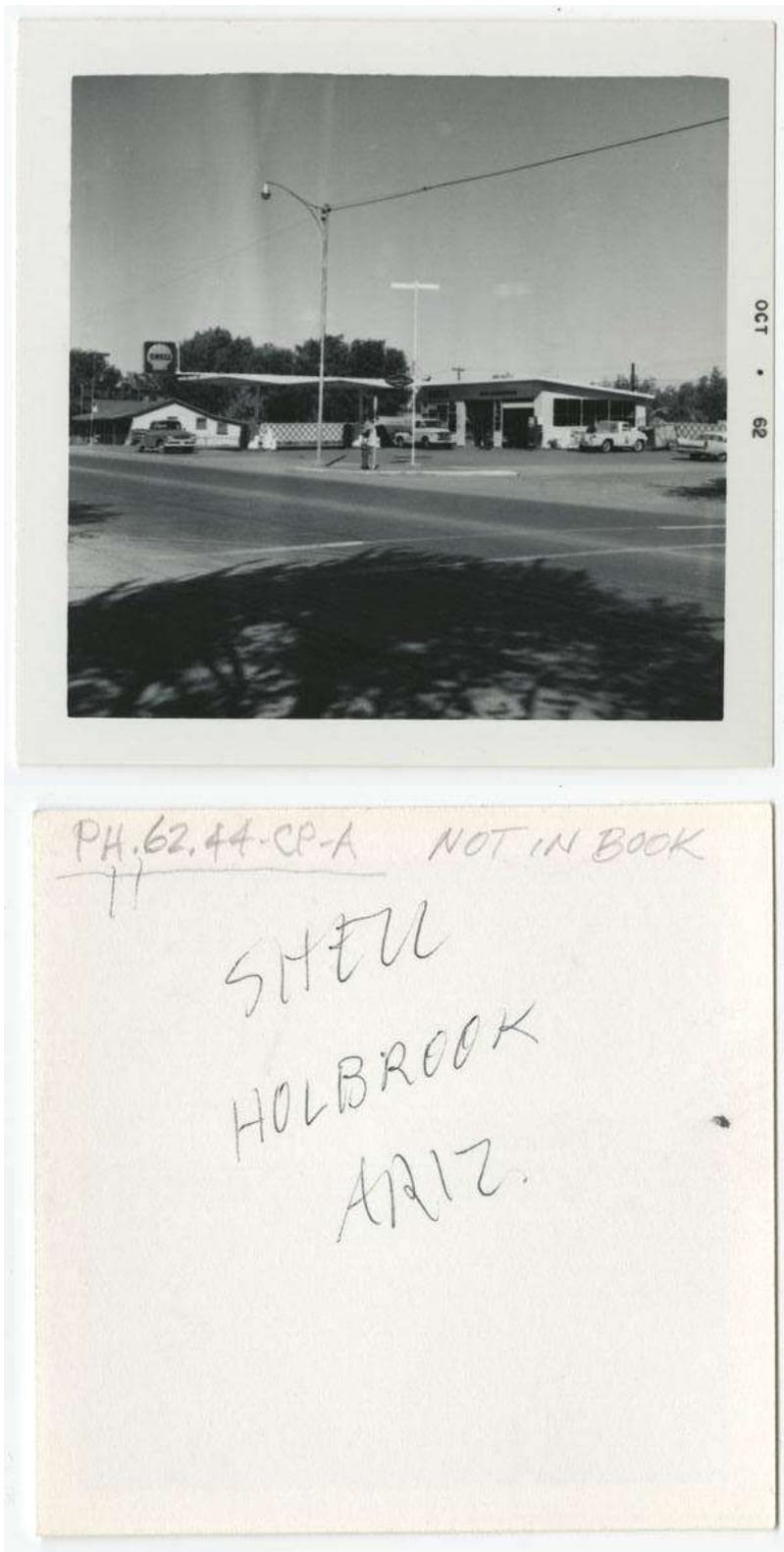


Figure 12 : Bernd et Hilla Becher, *Pitheads*, 1974. Neuf tirages argentiques noir et blanc sur papier, 133,3 x 131,8 cm, Tate, Londres.

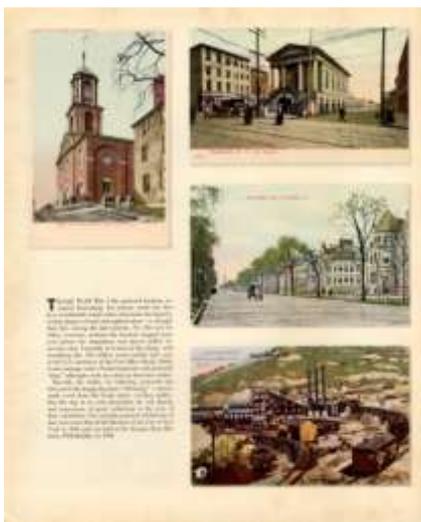
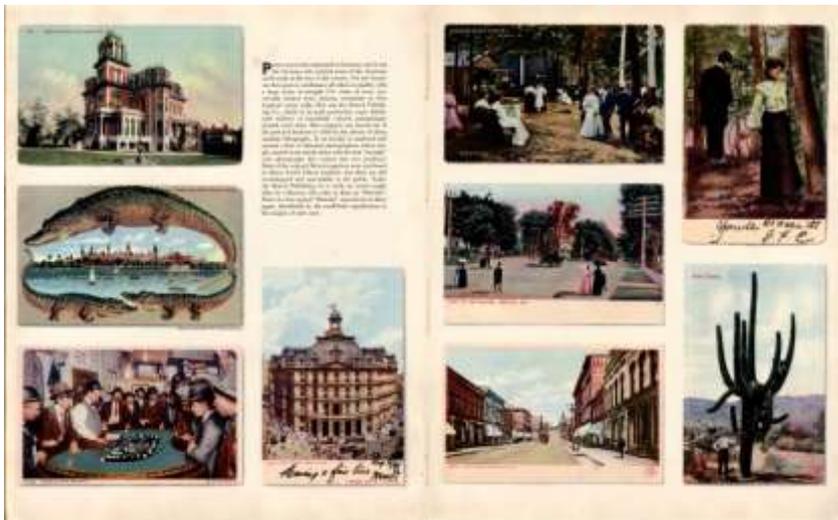


Figure 18 : Walker Evans, "Homes of Americans". *Fortune*, avril 1946.

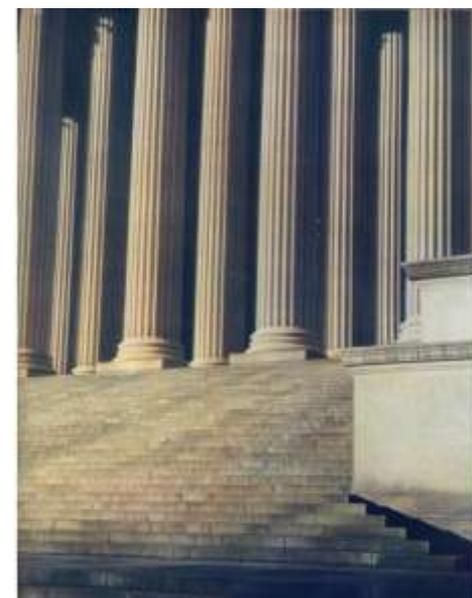
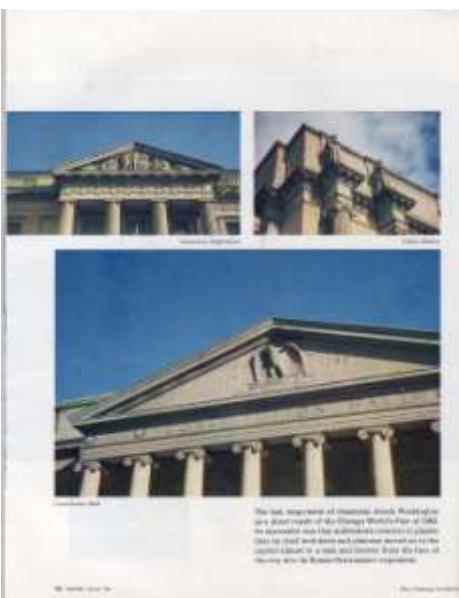
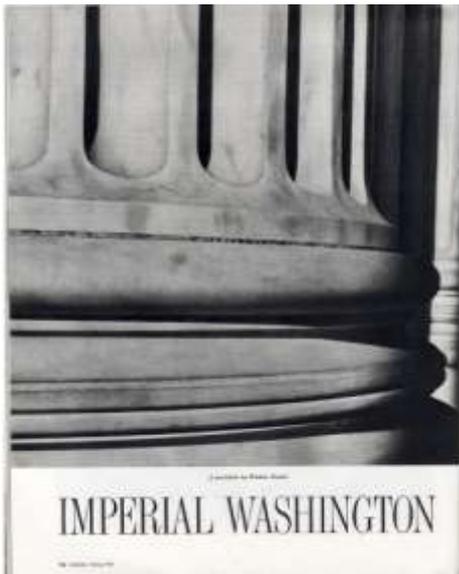


Figure 25 : Walker Evans, "The Pitch Direct", *Fortune*, octobre 1958.

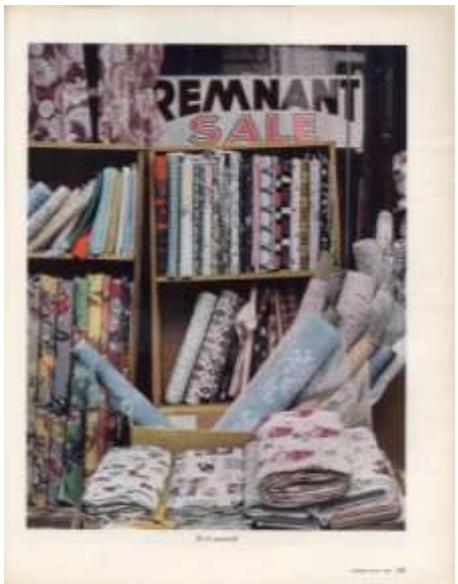
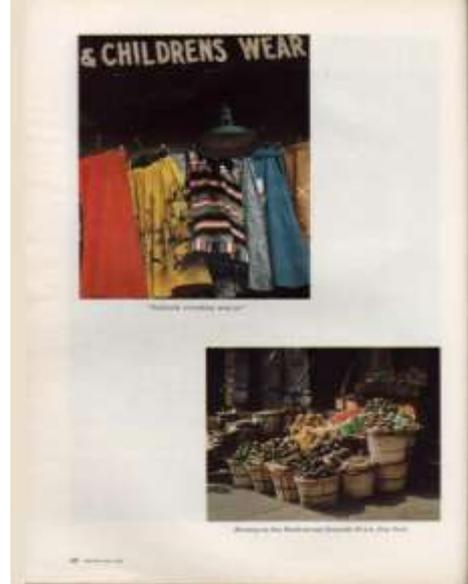
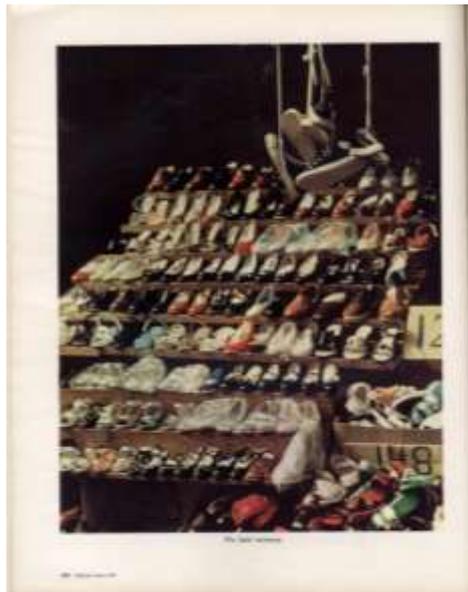


Figure 28 : Walker Evans, “Beauties of the Common Tool”, Fortune, juillet 1955.

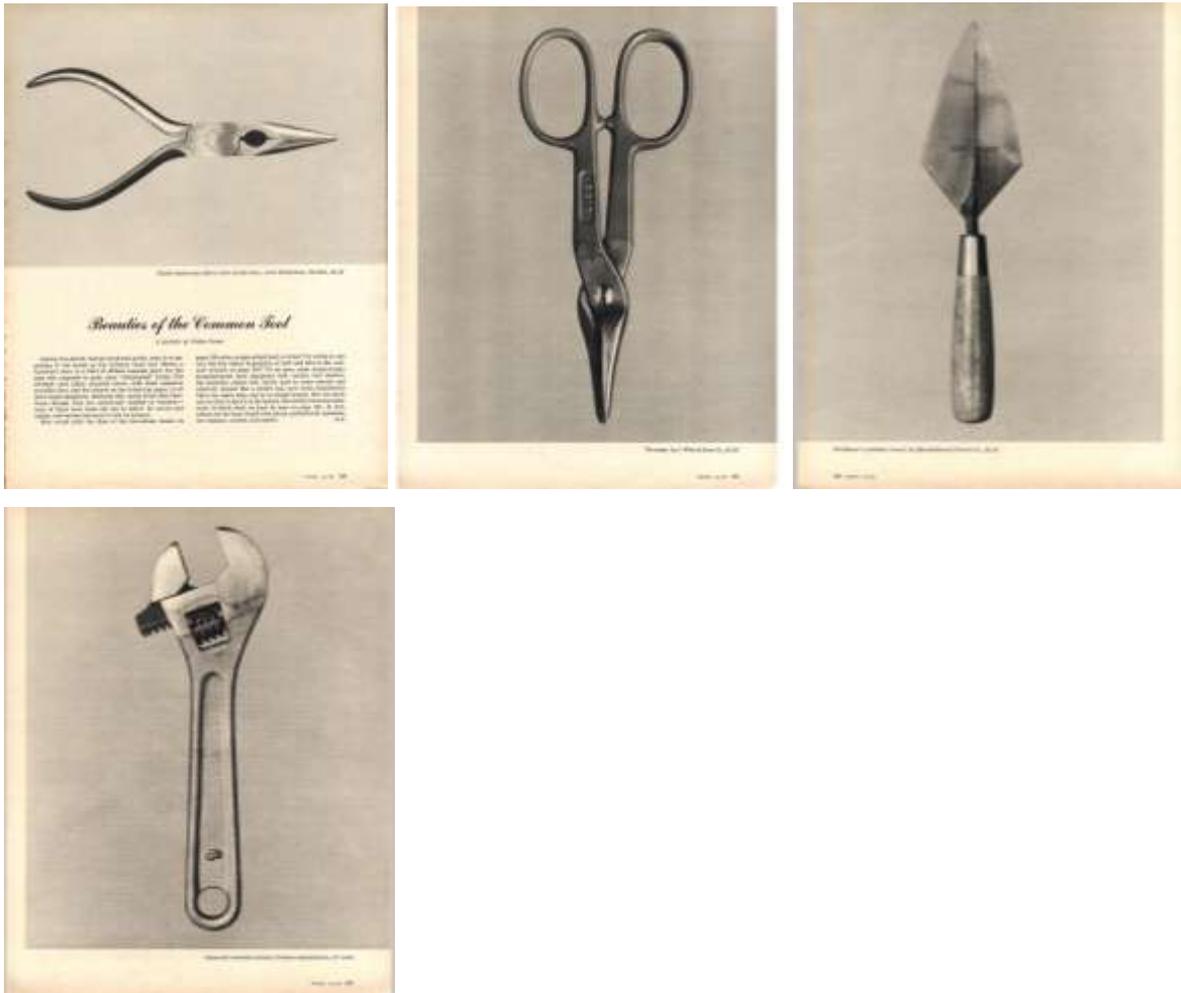


Figure 29 : Quatre éléments de la série d’Ed Ruscha, *Product Still Life*, 1961.

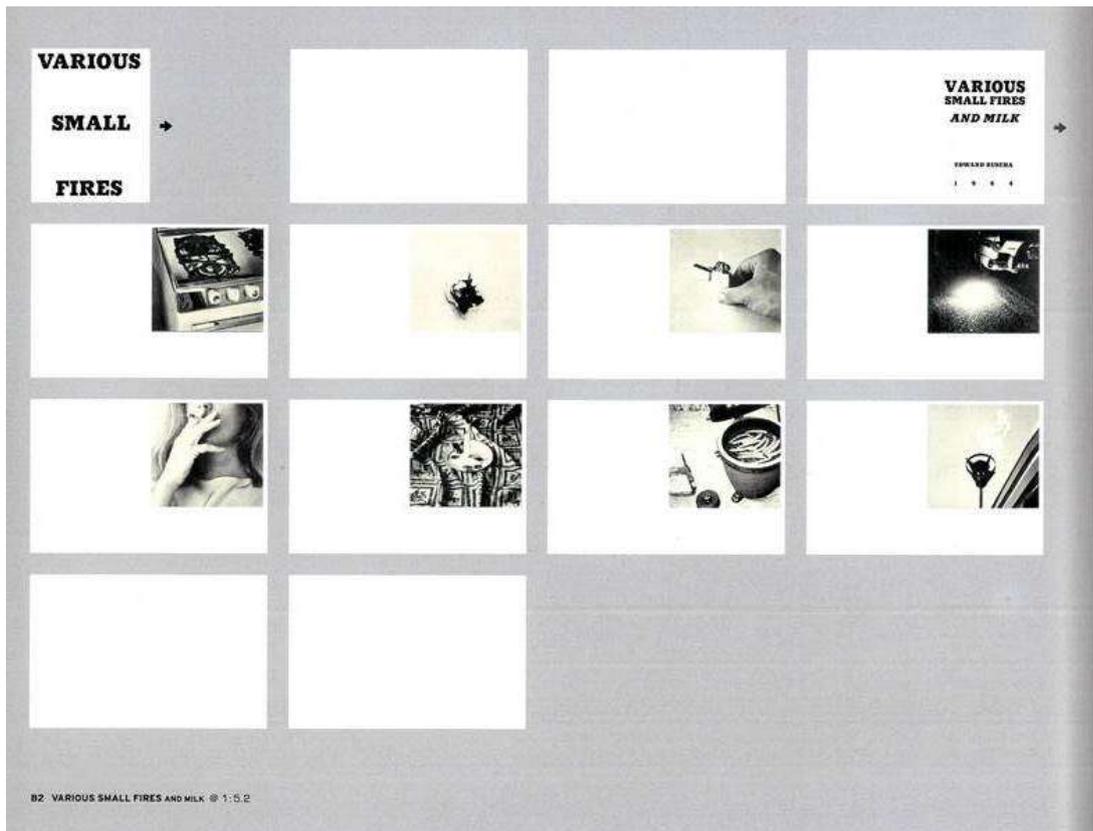
Figure 36 : Walker Evans, *Travel Notes*, Tahiti 1932

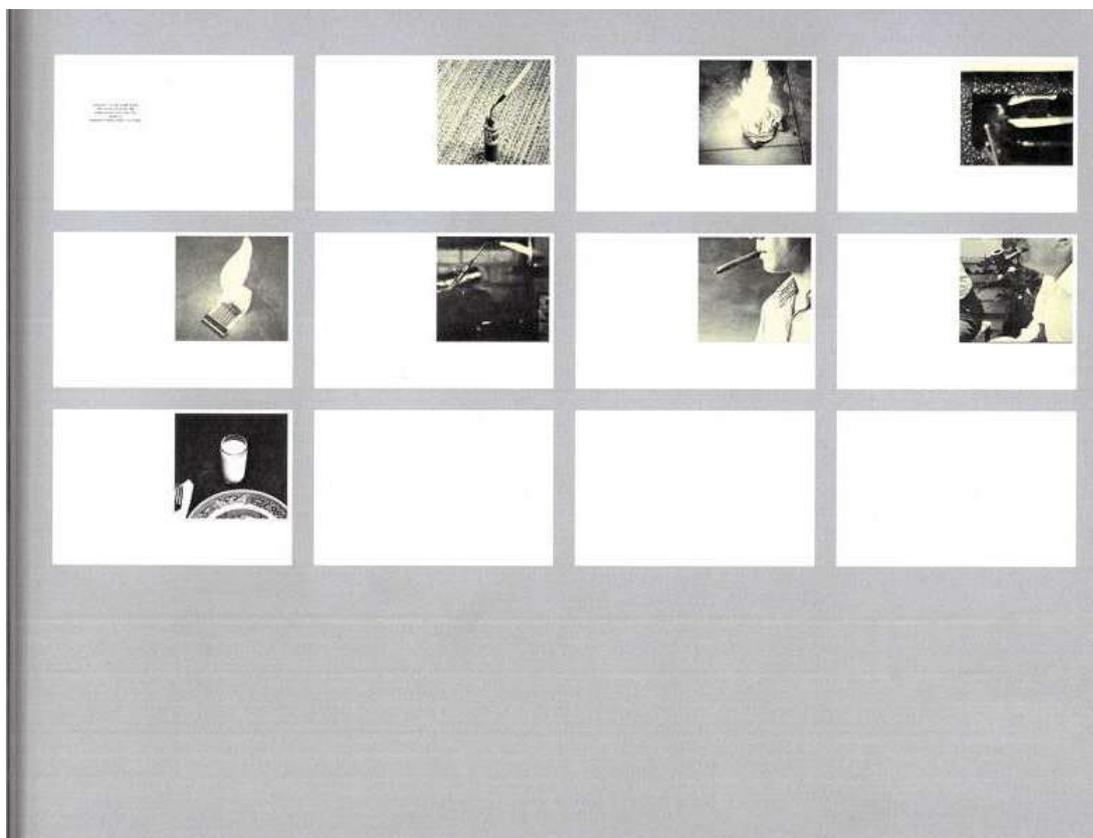


Figure 39 : Ed Ruscha, *Standard Station, Amarillo, Texas*, 1962. Tirage argentique, 12.5 × 12.9 cm, Whitney Museum of American Art, New York.

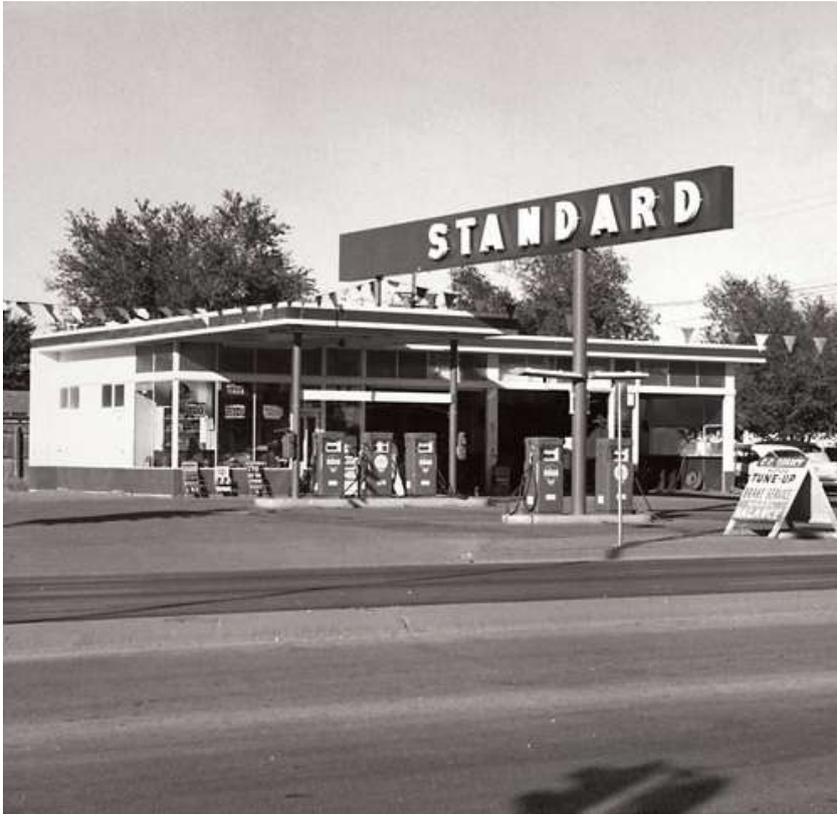


Figure 40 : Ed Ruscha, *Standard Station*, 1966. Screenprint, 49,6 x 93,8cm, MoMA.

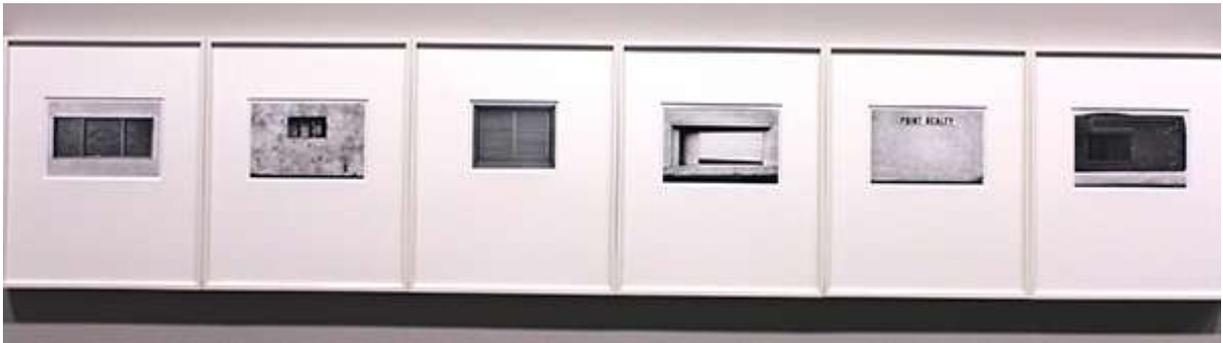


Figure 42 : Lewis Baltz, *Tract Houses*, 1969-1971. Vue de l'exposition « Lewis Baltz, Common Objects », Le BAL, Paris, 2014.

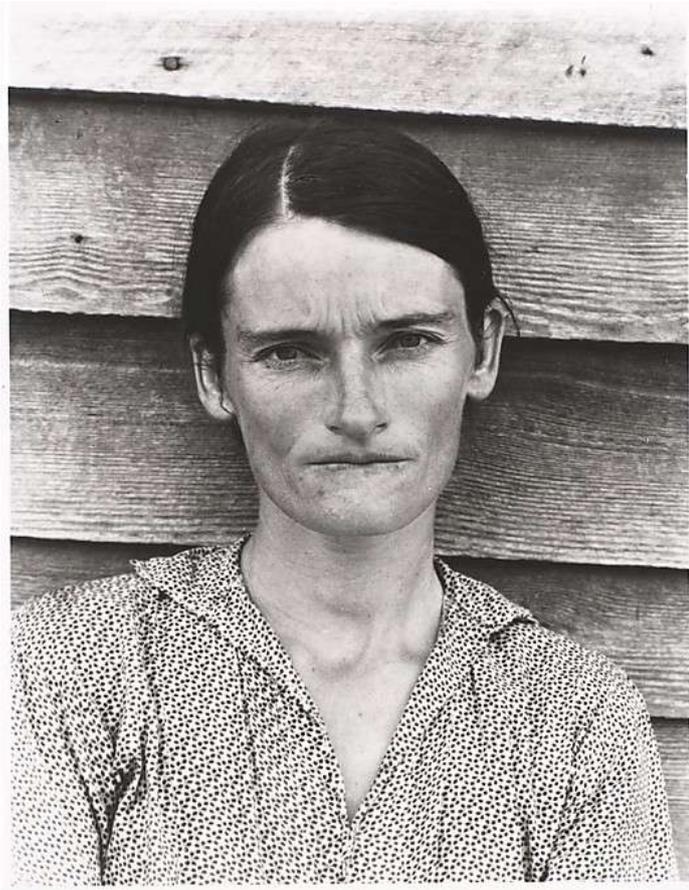


Figure 52 : Lisa Oppenheim, *Killed Negatives, After Walker Evans (Corn 2)*, 2007.

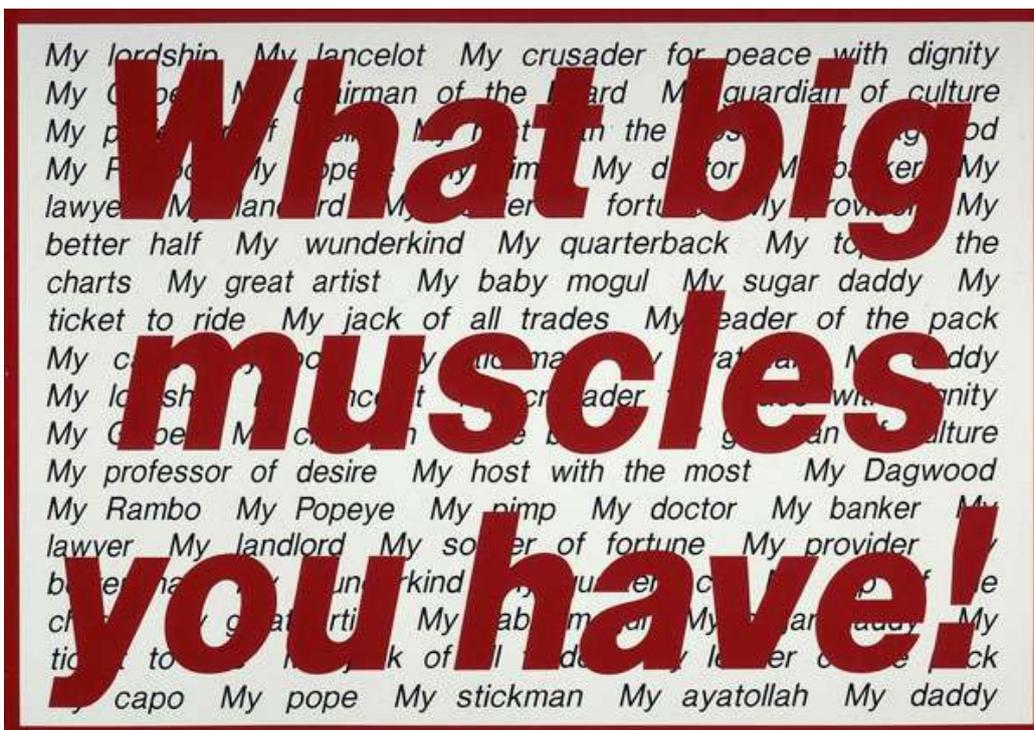


Figure 56 : Cyprien Gaillard, *Indian Palm Study*, 2011. Neuf polaroid encadrés de bois, 102 x 73 x 4 cm chacun, collection Pomeranz, Vienne, Autriche.

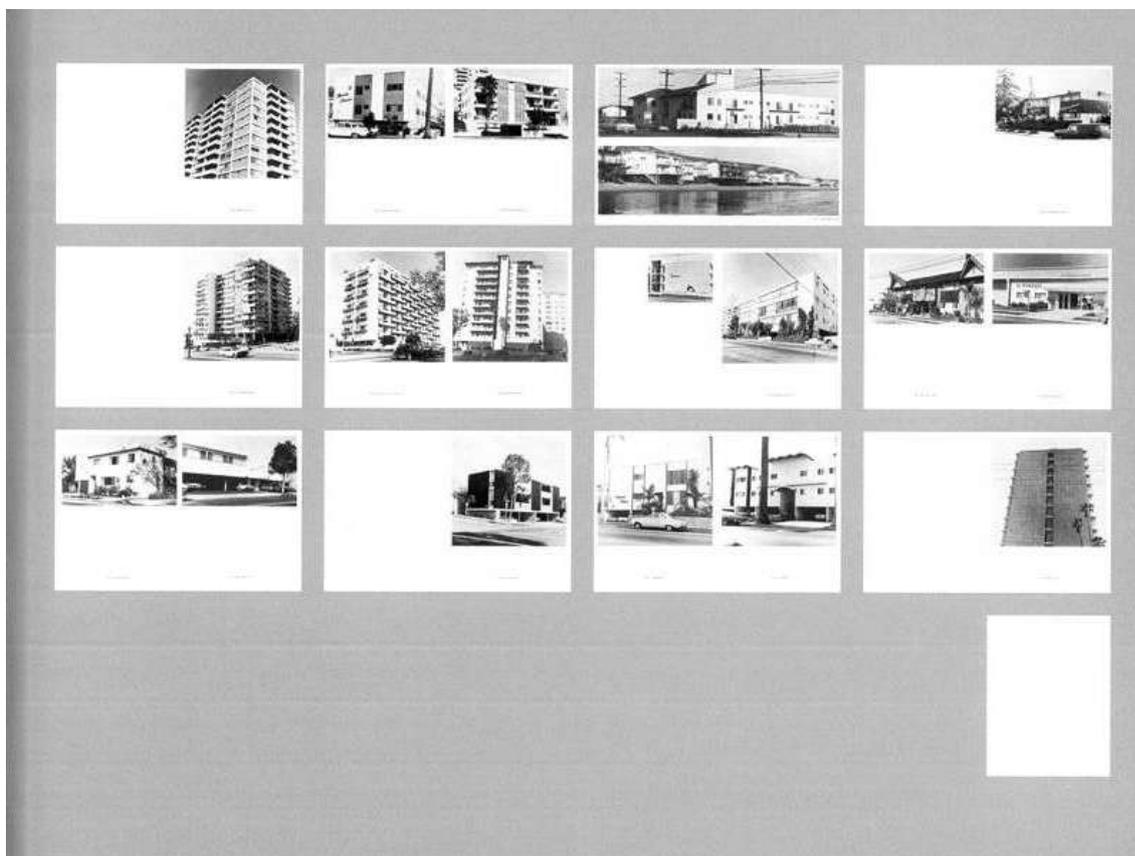
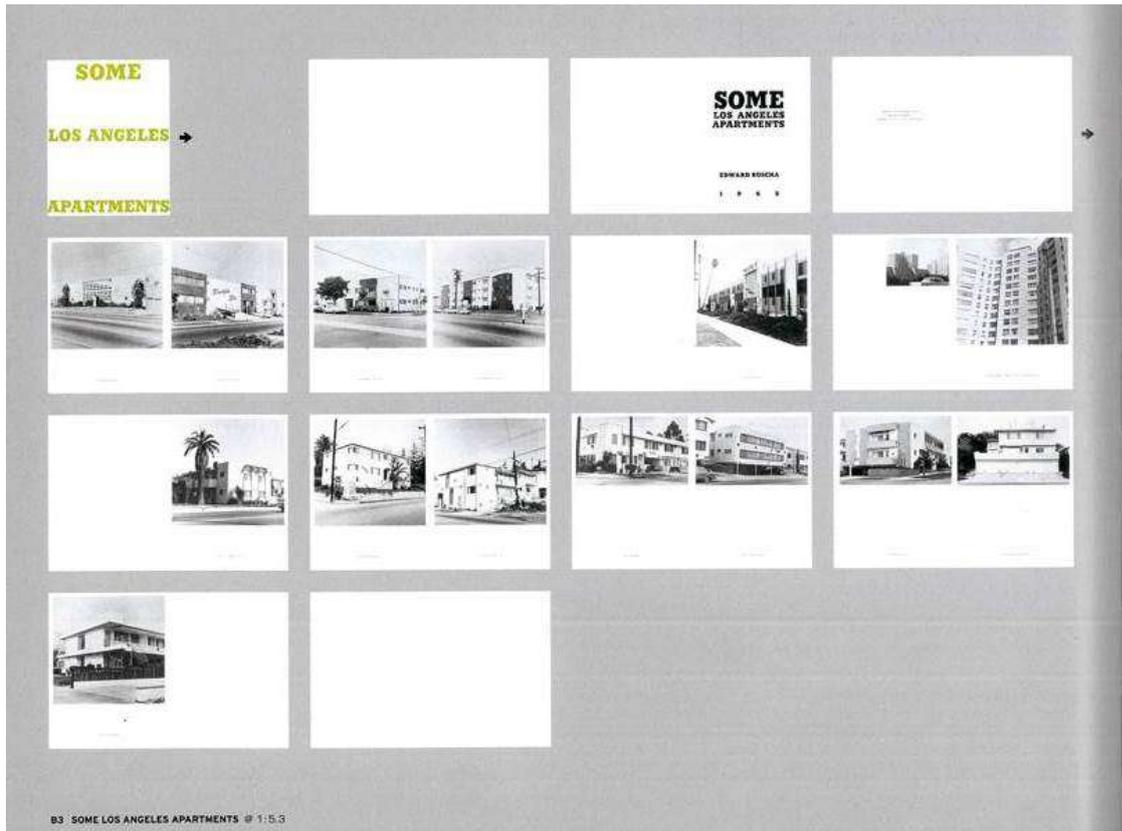


Figure 62 : Mathieu Mercier, *Le Pavillon*, 2003. Vue d'exposition au MNAM – centre G. Pompidou, 2003.

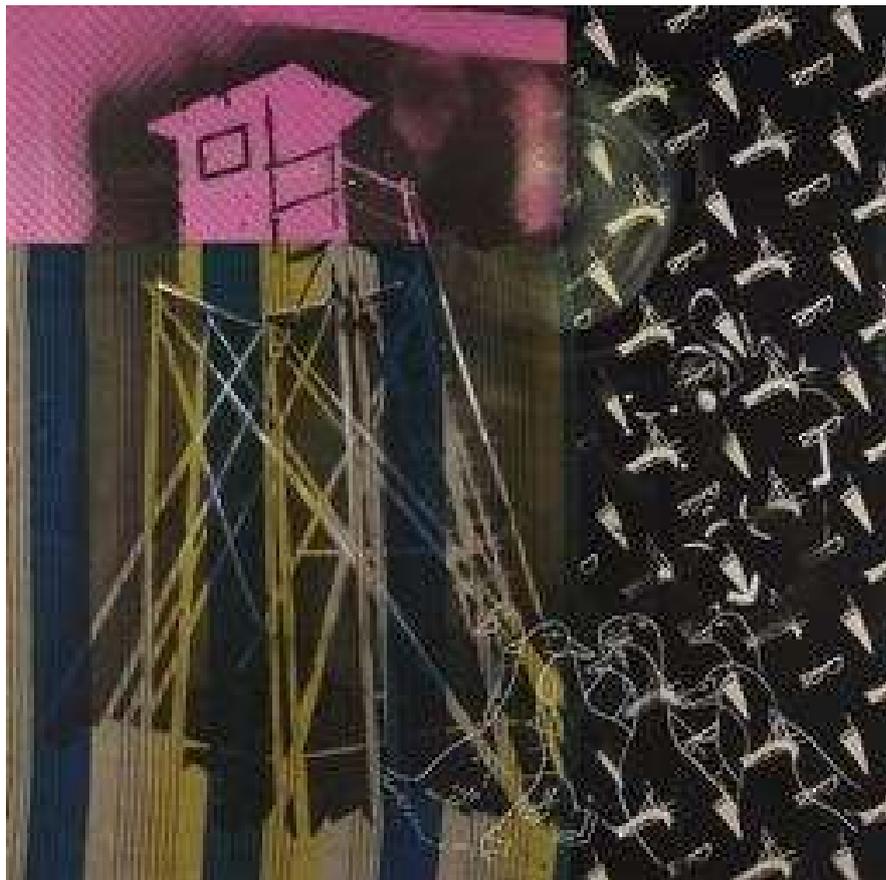


Figure 67 : Taysir Batniji, *GH0809*, 2010. Série de vingt tirages C-print, sur papier translucide brillant, 21 x 29,7 cm chacun, porte-affiche plexiglas, 30 x 38 cm chacun, dimensions de l'ensemble : 222 x 167 cm. Vue d'ensemble et détail, exposition « The Future of a Promise », 54^e biennale de Venise, 2011.

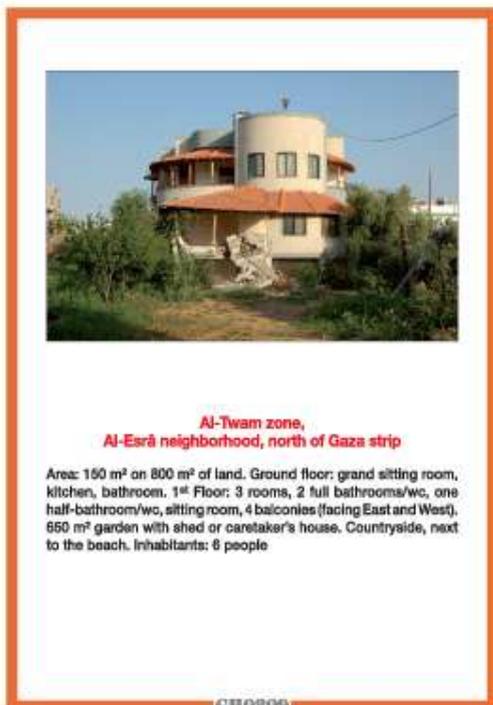


Figure 68 : Mathieu Mercier, *100 cars on Karl Marx Allee*, 2007. Lambdaprint, 160 x 120 cm, courtesy Galerie Mehdi Chouakri.
